



Nicholas Pennings, DO, DABOM, MFOMA, FACOFP, FAAFP, is a Professor of Family Medicine. He is board certified in Family Medicine and Obesity Medicine. He is recognized as a master fellow of the Obesity Medicine Association, a fellow of the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians, and a fellow of the American Academy of Family Physicians. Dr. Pennings moved from private practice into academic medicine joining the faculty of the Campbell University School of Osteopathic Medicine in 2013. He previously served as Family Medicine Chair, he also served as the director of the Campbell University Health Center.
